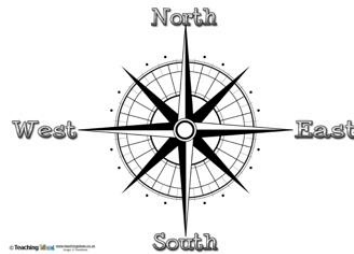

*The Tana River in the country's longest river.

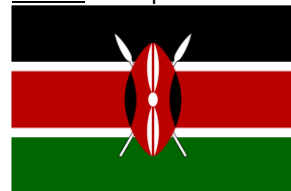
*The flag of Kenya has meaning
