Continents of the world	<p>Locational and Place knowledge Name and locate the world's 7 continents and 5 oceans, understanding the terms 'continent' and 'sea'.</p> <p>Human and Physical Geography Identify the location of hot and cold areas in the world in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles).</p> <p>Identify physical features place studied – Kenya. Understand the geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of a small area in a contrasting non-European country (Kenya linked to Africa topic and mountainous regions in Africa)</p>	<p>Locational and Place knowledge Use maps/globe/atlas to identify the continents and oceans and understand that both a map and a globe show the same thing. Locate the continents on a paper map. Locate and name UK on map (building on Year 1) but also locate major features EG London, River Thames, Home location and seas surrounding. Use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) to describe the location of features on a map.</p> <p>Human and Physical Geography</p> <p>Use both maps and globes, identify the coldest places in the world – The North and South pole. Make predictions about where the hottest places in the world are. Children to identify the equator and locate the continents on the Equator which are the hottest to then link into Kenya as the equator passes through Kenya.</p> <p>What they think life in Kenya is like. Whilst studying Kenya, use photographic evidence to raise questions about the climate and living conditions there. Make assumptions based on images/videos/Google Earth searches about life there and the animals which may survive in those conditions.</p> <p>Look at human and physical geographical features of Kenya such as mountainous regions, rivers, settlements and cities.</p> <p>Develop informed opinions about global warming in relation to the North and south pole and develop reasoned arguments about our role on the planet.
