As part of our Year 4 topics, we will be exploring the work of Roman Britain. For homework we would like the children to complete some of the activities below.

Please find below a list of activities for the children to choose from and to complete. We would recommend that during our time away from school the children choose a number of activities from the list. The more activities your child completes, the greatest benefit it will have to your child's learning.

Projects you may choose to complete:

<p>To make a leaflet about 'How the Romans have shaped Britain today'. This could be based on the following: Where did the Romans come from? To be able to locate Italy on a map. What is the impact of Roman Britain on the life of the British Isles, education, entertainment, technology eg roads, bridges, baths, coins?</p>	<p>To create a Roman God fact file including at least 3 different Gods. Can you write an explanation about the following, supporting your answers with evidence? Who was the strongest God? Which God was the most important? Which God was disliked the most?</p>	<p>To write a quiz about Romans, with accompanying answer sheet to test a friend.</p>
<p>To write a comparison between the similarities and differences to life in modern Britain. This could include information on the following: Towns houses and Villas and the role of Men/woman? Life for the rich and poor? Clothing, jobs, education and transport.</p>	<p>To make a model of a famous Roman building. To create a Roman shield. To sketch a Roman God using a variety of different pencil techniques. E.g shading, cross hatching etc.</p>	<p>To create a piece of artwork inspired by an artist of your choice. Write an explanation about why you have chosen this artist.</p>
<p>To create a time line displaying the events of the Roman Empire in Roman Britain including both words and pictures/drawings.</p>	<p>Record all the different ways that you have used electricity today e.g switched on lights, played on a tablet. Now decide if this is an 'essential' use e.g cooking food or 'non-essential' e.g. watching television.</p>	<p>To explore the activities on Education City. Including: English (reading and writing), Maths, Science and Computing. Continue to practice your Times Table Rockstars.</p>
