



Pupil Premium 2017-2018 Report

The government believes that the pupil premium, which is additional to main school funding, is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals, (FSM) and their peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches pupils who need it most.

Pupil premium was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years, (known as 'Ever 6 FSM').

Schools also receive funding for children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months and children of service personnel.

We track all pupil premium children carefully through school in terms of their academic, social and emotional attainment. Money will again be used to provide whole school opportunities and specific interventions for pupil premium children to support a range of enhanced learning experiences.
