

Remote Learning Offer at Perdiswell Primary School

This information is to be used as a general guide and parents can expect further details of remote learning for their child as and when it is required. We aim to implement remote learning from your child's second day of absence. There are 2 general scenarios outlined below; the first scenario where your child is not permitted to attend school and the second outlines the actions in the case of a whole bubble/class not being permitted to attend school.



Circumstance	Remote learning
<p>My child (<i>and their siblings if they are also attending Perdiswell Primary</i>) is absent because they are awaiting test results and our household is required to self-isolate. The rest of their school bubble are attending school and being taught as normal.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maths lessons uploaded to seesaw, following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. This may be a combination of white rose maths videos or power maths, the screens shared in the classroom and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. • English tasks uploaded to seesaw following the sequence of learning happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. Some/all of these will be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on Google Classroom for marking. • RWI sessions/tasks for KS1 to work on the sounds your child will be missing • Spelling activity for KS2 to work on the spellings your child will be missing • Topic task(s) may be the screens from the week's lessons being uploaded onto Seesaw along with resources / worksheets (if appropriate i.e. if the resources required for the lessons are already at home). If the lessons being taught in class are not able to be delivered remotely (e.g. if it requires additional resources such as art resources e.g. clay or pastels, or geography resources e.g. maps and atlases) then alternative 'topic' learning will be set on Seesaw or accessible on the school's website.
<p>My child's whole bubble/class is not permitted to attend school because they, or another member of their bubble/class, have tested positive for Covid-19.</p> <p>We enter another 'lockdown' with total school closure.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily Introductory video by the Year Group Staff of the day's activities. • Daily maths lessons via videos uploaded to seesaw, following on/mirroring the maths being covered in the classroom at that time. This may be a combination of white rose maths videos or power maths, the screens shared in the classroom and resources/worksheets used in the classroom. • A daily live maths session- opportunity to share workings out/misconceptions • English tasks uploaded to seesaw following the sequence of learning happening in the classroom. The quantity will be dependent on age/stage of your child. Some/all of these will be 'handed in' to your child's class teacher on seesaw for marking. • RWI sessions/tasks for KS1 via videos to work on the sounds your child will be missing • Reception RWI session via live Teams event. • KS2 Spelling activities loaded onto seesaw. • Small group video learning which will look different depending on the age of the children. The frequency of when your child's sessions will occur will be communicated by your child's class teacher via the year group emails. • Topic task(s) will be uploaded to Seesaw for children to complete and hand in virtually. • 1:1 support if your child receives 1:1 support and they are isolating, a more bespoke programme of support will be set up. This may include phone calls / video chats with your child's 1:1 support. They will usually be expected to still complete the learning set on seesaw.

* the video learning sessions will not be facilitated by your child's class teacher if the teacher is the one experiencing Covid symptoms and the reason for the bubble closure. We know our parents will understand that the health and wellbeing of our children, families and staff is paramount.
